June 13, 2013 · A Morgantown-based environmental consulting company, along with partners at West Virginia University, have been awarded \$250,000 to undertake an aquatic habitat assessment project.

Downstream Strategies will create a tool to help forecast current and potential habitat conditions under various land use, management, and climate scenarios.

This feature will assist in climate change adaptation and management, habitat quality forecasting, and natural resource planning by allowing users to visualize the effect of potential future changes on current habitat conditions.

Phase one of this project is already underway.
